CONSTRUCTION NOTICE:

CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES ON WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY PIPELINES ON QUINTANA ROAD BETWEEN BELLA VISTA DRIVE AND KINGS AVENUE

Sept. 16, 2021

In mid-September, construction will progress to the next section of Quintana Road from La Loma to Morro Bay Boulevard as part of the City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines: the section from Bella Vista Drive to Kings Avenue.

What To Expect: The WRF Pipelines include two wastewater pipelines, one pipeline for the water treatment process discharge, and one purified water pipeline. Construction will include trenching, pipe installation, soil backfilling and offhauling, and road restoration. Crews will install three pipelines now and will return at a later date to install the purified water pipeline.

> Construction will be completed in segments moving west from La Loma to Morro Bay Boulevard. One-way eastbound traffic will be maintained toward South Bay Boulevard.

> Access will be maintained for businesses, residences, emergency vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists. Driveways will remain accessible, and the project team will coordinate with businesses on an individual basis to accommodate deliveries and traffic. For the safety of the community and construction crews, traffic control will be in place. Please follow all posted signage near the work zone.

When:

Construction is scheduled on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Weekend or night work may be scheduled, as needed, but neighboring properties will be informed in advance of schedule changes. Construction on Quintana Road in the La Loma to Morro Bay Boulevard section is expected to be underway until November 2021.

Why:

The WRF Program is the largest-ever City infrastructure program, and will meet state water and wastewater regulations, protect the environment and contribute a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's residents and businesses. The WRF Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will create a drought buffer and will be capable of providing up to 80 percent of the City's water needs in the future.
