CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY PIPELINES AT CORNER OF MAIN STREET AND QUINTANA ROAD

Sept. 17, 2021

Pipeline construction is scheduled to begin on **Wednesday, Sept. 22**, on the City of Morro Bay's Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines near the corner of Main Street and Quintana Road in the parking lot at 341 Quintana Road. The WRF Program is the largest-ever City infrastructure program, and will meet state water and wastewater regulations, protect the environment and contribute a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's residents and businesses.

What To Expect: This work will be primary out of the public right-of-way, but it will require traffic control in the westbound lane on Quintana Road between Main Street and Kennedy Way. During this phase, all driveways will remain open and accessible from Main Street.

For the safety of the community and construction crews, please follow all posted signage near the work zone and plan extra time for traveling through the work zone.

When: Construction is scheduled on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and work at the corner of Main Street and Quintana Road is scheduled to take about two weeks beginning on **Wednesday, Sept. 22**. Weekend or night work may be scheduled, as needed, but neighboring properties will be informed in advance of schedule changes.

Following the work at the corner of Main Street and Quintana Road, the contractor will move north on Main Street and Quintana Place where they will work toward the bike path work zone. During construction on Main Street, which is expected to take about six to eight weeks, two-way traffic will be maintained.

Why: The City of Morro Bay is investing in the construction of the WRF Program to protect our environment, and provide a safe, clean and reliable water supply for our community, both current and future generations. The WRF Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will create a drought buffer and will be capable of providing up to 80 percent of the City's water needs in the future.

The City is committed to clear communication and providing up-to-date information about construction activities. Construction notices will be regularly posted on morrobaywrf.com.
