### **CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES ON QUINTANA ROAD BETWEEN MAIN STREET AND KENNEDY WAY**

June 13, 2022

Construction of the fourth and final pipeline as part of the City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines is scheduled to begin on Quintana Road on **Monday, June 20**, between Main Street and Kennedy Way. The WRF Program is the largest-ever City infrastructure program, and will meet state water and wastewater regulations, protect the environment and be capable of providing a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's residents and businesses in the future.

**What To Expect:** Three pipelines were already constructed in this area in 2021; this construction is for the fourth and final pipeline as part of the project. Construction will include trenching, pipe installation, soil backfilling and offhauling, and road restoration.

Construction will be completed in segments starting on Quintana Road southeast of Main Street and moving southeast within the public right-of-way. Southbound traffic on Quintana Road will be detoured at Main Street via Dunes Street and Kennedy Way. Northbound traffic on Quintana Road will remain open.

Access will be maintained for businesses, residences, emergency vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists. Driveways to businesses will remain accessible, and the project team will coordinate with businesses on an individual basis to accommodate deliveries and traffic. For the safety of the community and construction crews, traffic control, such as signage and barricades, will be in place. Please follow all posted signage near the work zone.

**When:** Construction is scheduled on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and work on Quintana Road is scheduled to begin on **Monday, June 20**. Weekend or night work may be scheduled, as needed, but neighboring properties will be informed in advance of schedule changes.

**Why:** The City of Morro Bay is investing in the construction of the WRF Program that will protect our environment, and be capable of providing a safe, clean and reliable water supply for our community, both current and future generations. The WRF Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will create a drought buffer.

The City is committed to clear communication and providing up-to-date information about construction activities.
