SATURDAY WORK SCHEDULED FOR MORRO BAY WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY PIPELINES

Construction is scheduled on **Saturday, June 18**, as part of the City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines.

What To Expect: Construction work will be focused on the support infrastructure associated with the

WRF Pipelines, including fiber optic trenches and vaults in multiple locations. Construction will occur in up to two locations at a time along Quintana Road from Main Street to Las Tunas and on Teresa Road. Minor traffic control will be in place for the safety of construction crews and the traveling public. In some cases, there may be alternating one-way traffic; in other cases, two-way traffic may be maintained.

Please plan extra time when traveling on Quintana Road.

When: In addition to normal weekday work, crews will work on Saturday, June 18. Work at

each location is expected to take up to four hours.

Why: The City of Morro Bay is investing in the construction of the WRF Program that will

protect our environment, and provide a safe, clean and reliable water supply for our

community, both current and future generations. The WRF Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will meet state regulations, protect the environment, and contribute a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's homes and businesses.

The project will create a drought buffer.
