### City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Saturday Work Scheduled on Main Street

Construction is scheduled on four Saturdays – Nov. 20, Dec. 4, Dec. 11 and Dec. 18 – on Main Street near Quintana Road as part of the City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines. Construction is underway in segments between Quintana Place and the bike path with two-way traffic maintained with flaggers through the work zone.

For safety and to control the flow of traffic near the work zone, the traffic signal at Main Street and Quintana Road will be flashing red during this work for the safety of the public and construction crews. A flashing red traffic signal light means "STOP." After stopping, you may proceed when it is safe. Please observe all right-of-way rules. Cyclists and motorists will share the lanes on Main Street, so please use extra caution and Slow for the Cone Zone. Remember people riding bikes have the same rights and responsibilities as people driving motor vehicles. Cyclists uncomfortable with sharing the road through the construction zone can use alternative routes to North Morro Bay such as the Morro Creek bike path to Atascadero Road and points North.

Access will be maintained for businesses, residences and emergency vehicles. Driveways to businesses will remain open, and the project team will coordinate with businesses on an individual basis to accommodate deliveries and traffic.

**When: Work is scheduled for four Saturdays – Nov. 20, Dec. 4, Dec. 11 and Dec. 18 – from 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. No work is scheduled on Sundays. Construction will continue on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.**

The WRF Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will create a drought buffer and will be capable of providing up to 80 percent of the City's water needs in the future.
