City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update

Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations:

- **Quintana Road southeast of the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout:** One lane of traffic will be maintained and controlled by flaggers while a temporary sewer bypass is installed. Street parking will be removed for safety while the sewer bypass is in place through June 2021.
- **Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard:** The road is closed for pipeline construction, which will begin on Monday, March 29. The road closure is expected to be in place until June 2021, and the posted detour is Highway 1. Access for businesses and emergency vehicles is available from the La Loma side of the closure.
- **Lift station sites on Embarcadero Road and Main Street:** No road closures will be needed for construction activities on both City-owned properties. There will be pile-driving activities at the lift station site on Main Street during the week of March 29, and neighboring properties may experience noise and vibrations during work hours.
- **Main Street between Highway 1 and Quintana Road:** Starting on Monday, April 5, the four pipelines will be constructed in segments moving southeast. Two-way traffic will be maintained, and driveways will remain accessible. Construction activities will include trenching, tunneling, pipe installation, soil backfilling and offhauling, and road restoration.

Construction is scheduled on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Weekend or night work may be scheduled, as needed, but neighboring properties will be informed in advance of schedule changes. The schedule calls for the majority of construction activities to be completed by December 2021.
