City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update

Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations:

- **Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard:** The road is closed for pipeline construction. The road closure is expected to be in place until June 2021, and the posted detour is Highway 1. Access for businesses and emergency vehicles is available from the La Loma side of the closure.
- **Lift station sites on Embarcadero Road and Main Street:** No road closures will be in place but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the areas near the lift station sites. Excavation work is scheduled in the next few weeks at the lift stations site on Embarcadero Road, and structural work, such as rebar placement, is scheduled at the lift station site on Main Street.
- **Main Street between Highway 1 and Quintana Road:** Traffic control is currently in place for underground utility location work prior to pipeline installation. To access businesses/driveways on the east side of Main Street near Quintana Place, please access from the northbound lanes. Two-way traffic will be maintained on Main Street. Construction activities are starting in this area on May 10 and will include trenching, tunneling, pipe installation, soil backfilling and offhauling, and road restoration.
