City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update

Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations from north to south.

- **Lift station site on Embarcadero Road:** No road closures will be in place but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- **Lift station site on Main Street:** No road closures will be in place but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- **UPDATE - Quintana Road from Main Street to Kennedy Way:** The northbound lane on Quintana Road is closed, and northbound traffic is detoured at Kennedy Way to Dunes Street and Main Street. Southbound traffic on Quintana Road will remain open and all businesses will be accessible from the southbound lane. In addition to daytime construction in this area, evening construction from 5:30 to 10:30 p.m. is scheduled on May 25, 26 and 27, 2021. Please expect delays as traffic will be sharing the southbound lane with heavy construction equipment during the evening work.
- **Las Tunas Street and Quintana Road:** Southern California Gas Company (SoCal Gas) is relocating a gas line to prepare for the City's pipeline construction. Las Tunas Street will be closed at Quintana Road beginning May 25. Residents on Las Tunas Street and Balboa Street between Butte Avenue and Kings Avenue should use Kings Avenue for access. Looking ahead to June 2021, activities in this area include preparing the pits (driving sheet piles, dewatering and excavation) on either side of the pipeline tunnel under the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout.
- **Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard:** The road is closed for pipeline construction until June 2021, and the posted detour is Highway 1. Access to properties in this area is via South Bay Boulevard.
- Underground utility investigation work is ongoing on Quintana Road through May 2021. Minor traffic control, like signage and cones, will be in place to direct traffic around the active work areas. No full road closures or detours will occur as part of this work.
