City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update

Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations from north to south.

- Lift station site on Embarcadero Road: No road closures will be in place but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- **Lift station site on Main Street:** No road closures will be in place but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- UPDATE Quintana Road near Kennedy Way: Construction crews must relocate a
 water main through the intersection of Quintana Road and Kennedy Way, in addition to
 ongoing pipeline construction on Quintana Road. Quintana Road is closed between 420
 Quintana Road and Kennedy Way until Friday, July 2, with posted detours on Main Street
 and Morro Bay Boulevard. Kennedy Way will be open to local business traffic, and
 through traffic will be detoured at Shasta Avenue. After the pipelines are installed on
 Quintana Road across Kennedy Way, Quintana Road will be open to southbound traffic
 only. All businesses will remain open and accessible. Please follow all posted signage and
 crew member directions near the work zone and expect delays in the area.
- Las Tunas Street and Quintana Road: Construction crews are currently preparing the
 pits (driving sheet piles, dewatering and excavation) on either side of the pipeline tunnel
 under the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout. Tunneling activities will begin in July 2021.
- UPDATE Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard: The road is closed for pipeline construction, and the posted detour is Highway 1. Beginning Tuesday, June 29, properties in this area will be accessed via La Loma.
- Underground utility investigation work is ongoing on Quintana Road through June 2021.
 Minor traffic control, like signage and cones, will be in place to direct traffic around the active work areas. No full road closures or detours will occur as part of this work.
