## City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update

Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations from north to south.

- **Lift station site on Embarcadero Road:** No road closures will be in place, but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- **Lift station site on Main Street:** No road closures will be in place, but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- **UPDATE - Quintana Road between Kennedy Way and the roundabout:** During the week of July 12, construction crews will move to Quintana Road southeast of Kennedy Way, with construction moving toward the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout. In this section, southbound traffic will be maintained on Quintana Road, and northbound traffic will be detoured at the roundabout via Morro Bay Boulevard, Harbor Street and Kennedy Way. All businesses in the area will remain open and accessible from Kennedy Way. Work in this area is expected to take six to eight weeks.
- **Las Tunas Street and Quintana Road:** Tunneling activities will begin during the week of July 19 and will be completed in early August. Traffic will be maintained through the roundabout during the tunneling activities, but Las Tunas Street near Quintana Road will remain closed.
- **UPDATE - Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard:** Properties in this area currently have two-way access via La Loma. At the end of July, construction crews will open Quintana Road between La Loma and South Bay Boulevard, and move to South Bay Boulevard. During this work, the Highway 1 ramps at South Bay Boulevard will be impacted for approximately two weeks. Specific dates and detours will be released as soon as they are approved by the California Department of Transportation.
