City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update


Construction is underway on the WRF Pipelines in the following locations from north to south.

- Lift station site on Embarcadero Road: No road closures will be in place, but please expect additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- NEW Bike Path Between Atascadero Road and Main Street: Starting the week of Aug. 16, the bike path will be closed to the public for several months for pipeline construction. The posted bicycle and pedestrian detour is Atascadero Road and Main Street. Cyclists and pedestrians should plan extra time for traveling through the detour, including travel to Morro Bay High School.
- Lift station site on Main Street: No road closures will be in place, but please expect
 additional construction-related traffic in the area near the lift station site.
- Quintana Road between Kennedy Way and the roundabout: Construction is moving toward the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout. Eastboundd traffic is maintained on Quintana Road, and westbound traffic is detoured at the roundabout via Morro Bay Boulevard, Harbor Street and Kennedy Way. All businesses in the area will remain open and accessible from Kennedy Way. Work in this area is expected to last through August.
- Las Tunas Street and Quintana Road: Tunneling under the Morro Bay Boulevard
 roundabout is underway with specialized tunneling equipment. The roundabout is open,
 but Las Tunas Street near Quintana Road will remain closed. Due to the location of some
 critical equipment, please access Morro Bay Coffee Company via Kings Avenue and
 Balboa Street. Watch a flyover video of the tunneling preparation work here.
- NEW Quintana Road between La Loma and the roundabout: During the week of Aug. 2, the contractor began working at La Loma Avenue and Quintana Road, with construction moving toward the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout. The eastbound lane on Quintana Road is open, and the westbound lane is closed to traffic except for access to business driveways. Residences and businesses requiring access via Quintana Road between La Loma Avenue and Morro Bay Boulevard should access the area from the Morro Bay Boulevard roundabout.
