City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Scheduled to Start in February 2021

In early February 2021, construction is slated to begin on the City of Morro Bay's Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) Pipelines and Lift Stations. The WRF Program is the largest-ever City infrastructure program, and will meet state water and wastewater regulations, protect the environment and contribute a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's residents and businesses.

Construction Zone Starting Points - February 2021

In February, crews will begin pipeline construction in two areas (see map below):

- On Quintana Road moving southeast from La Loma to South Bay Boulevard At Main Street and Quintana Road moving southeast along Quintana Road
- Attacadero Road

What To Expect:

Pipelines

The WRF Pipelines include two wastewater pipelines, one pipeline for the water treatment process discharge, and one purified water pipeline. The four pipelines will be constructed in segments on Atascadero Road, Main Street, Quintana Road and South Bay Boulevard. The construction will include trenching, tunneling, pipe installation, soil backfilling and offhauling, and road restoration, as well as construction of support infrastructure including two new lift stations.

Construction will be completed in segments within the public right-of-way, to limit public impacts at any given time and to allow for access between cross streets. Lane closures and, when needed, detours will be in place for traffic circulation and access. The City is committed to maintaining business, residential and emergency vehicle access to properties throughout construction. The project team will work throughout the project to minimize inconveniences associated with traffic, construction noise and large construction equipment.

For the safety of the community and construction crews, traffic control mechanisms such as signage, barricades and flag people, will be in place. Please follow all posted signage and crew member directions near the work zone.

When

Construction is scheduled on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Weekend or night work may be scheduled, as needed, but neighboring properties will be informed in advance of schedule changes. The schedule calls for the majority of construction activities to be completed by December 2021.
