## City of Morro Bay Water Reclamation Facility Pipelines Construction Update: Overnight Road Closure on Quintana Road at La Loma

For public safety and out of an abundance of caution around an open trench at Quintana Road and La Loma, the intersection will be closed overnight tonight, Wednesday, Sept. 15. The City's contractor is installing a storm drain across the intersection, and placing trench plates would be unsafe for the trench conditions. The intersection will be reopened to southbound traffic on Thursday, Sept. 16.

Residences and businesses between Morro Bay Boulevard and La Loma can be accessed via Morro Bay Boulevard (southbound on Quintana Road) or from Allesandro Street. Residences and businesses between South Bay Boulevard and La Loma can be accessed via South Bay Boulevard (northbound on Quintana Road). Emergency responders have been notified about the closure and will plan accordingly.
