WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY PROJECT MILESTONE: FIRST SIGNIFICANT CONCRETE PLACEMENT

In early August 2020, the City of Morro Bay began significant concrete placement activities as part of the Water Reclamation Facility project, the largest public works infrastructure project in City history. The concrete slab placement was focused on the holding tank lower sump area and half of the basin foundation slab at the Water Reclamation Facility site on South Bay Boulevard east of Highway 1.

The first concrete placement for the holding tank includes 50 cubic yards or 100 tons of concrete and approximately 3,700 feet of rebar weighing more than six tons.

The first half of the concrete placement for the basin foundation includes 245 cubic yards or 500 tons of concrete and approximately 13,000 feet of rebar weighing more than 22 tons.

The City of Morro Bay is investing in the construction of the Water Reclamation Facility Program that will protect our environment, and provide a safe, clean and reliable water supply for our community.

The Water Reclamation Facility Program involves replacing the City's existing wastewater treatment plant with an advanced water purification facility that will meet state regulations, protect the environment, and contribute a safe and reliable water source for Morro Bay's homes and businesses. The project will create a drought buffer and will be capable of providing up to 80 percent of the City's water needs in the future.
